Electronic Filing Details

- e-Filing Filing deadline is **11:59 pm**
- e-Filing is required for most cases, with specific **exceptions**.

Pro se litigants are not required to e-file and represented litigants may be excused from efiling by **application to the court** ' if they demonstrate undue hardship or significant prejudice.

This court has no proprietary efiling portal, so you must use a third-party Electronic Filing and Service Provider (EFSP).

Asbestos, Complex, Probate, Family Law Dissolutions, Appellate and Misdemeanor must be effected exclusively via File & Serve Express.

Things You Need to Know

Critical Items

- Courtesy copies are required by 1:30 pm the next business day after documents are e-filed (except for ex parte).
- File stamped copies will be available the day after the filing has been processed.
- When eFiling, each document uploaded separately must have a <u>caption page as a cover</u> **sheet**. **There is an exception for single-page documents.**


Departments by Scope of Case

Limited cases are claims under \$25,000. Unlimited cases are claims over \$25,000. In addition, the San Francisco Superior Court is one of six in California with a "Complex Civil Litigation" designation.



Q: What are the requirements to highlight redacted portions of the unredacted versions of documents?

A: The sealed, un-redacted document must be e-filed and the first caption page must have "UN-REDACTED" in CAPS, BOLD and UNDERLINED under the title of the document with a space between the end of the title and "UN-REDACTED".

> The UN-REDACTED document will be filed as conditionally sealed until the court renders its ruling. The format and content of the unredacted document must contain all confidential and public portions. The redacted document must be identical to the unredacted document, however the confidential information must be properly redacted as noted above.
